When we arrived in Norfolk, we did our usual rounds of all the green pat and open areas marked on the OS maps, and were despairing of flat ridedivided forests and bramble covered scrubland, interspersed with gorse bushes and thistles, when one sunny day in summer we decided to go to the There we found a beautiful ridge of undulating valleys close to a large area of relatively flat mixed woodland surrounding a stately home. (My contribution to the map was to check an area of rides which now will not be used for the event!) I struggled with scores of letters, phone calls and visits to find an event centre/parking area, and this really defined the area of woodland we could use. Eventually (months later) that was sorted out, and I started on the other side, recruiting helpers, finding equipment, getting information duplicated, and trying to think of everything.
